- The memes provided a form of commentary on the situation experienced by Poles
- The most common category was that "bans and orders", involving restrictions that were often criticized and ridiculed as pointless
- The main characters within the memes were the citizens, portrayed in a comedic way as irresponsible
- The police and the government were also represented as victims
- Those responsible for fighting the pandemic were portrayed as incompetent, imposing needlessly severe restrictions and penalties for not abiding by them
