significant difficulties in identifying the quality of the information.

Their media diet combines digital media and social media as a priority.



CONCLUSIONS

Although skills improve as the training progresses, the evolution is far from optimal, since it does not reach even half the students.

The practice of consuming quality information and its adequate recognition must be understood as useful tools for training journalists.



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
